Section A: Reading

Q1. Read the passage carefully.

- 1. The rainforest ecosystem is often referred to as the "lungs of the Earth" due to its role in producing oxygen and absorbing carbon dioxide through photosynthesis. These ecosystems are characterized by their dense vegetation, tall trees, and a multilayered structure that includes the forest floor, understory, canopy, and emergent layers.
- 2. The forest floor, though shaded from direct sunlight, is teeming with life. Decomposing plant matter creates a nutrient-rich layer that supports various fungi, insects, and small animals. The understory, located just above the forest floor, is home to plants adapted to low light conditions. Many species of birds, insects, and reptiles thrive in this layer.
- 3. The canopy layer, formed by the interconnected branches and leaves of tall trees, receives the most sunlight. It is a bustling hub of activity with a diverse range of animal species, including monkeys, birds, and tree-dwelling mammals. The leaves in this layer are designed to capture sunlight efficiently, and some even have adaptations to repel water and prevent overcrowding by other plants.
- 4. The emergent layer consists of the tallest trees that rise above the canopy. These trees have access to the most sunlight and provide perches for birds of prey and nesting sites for various animals. Some animals, like the harpy eagle, are uniquely adapted to life in this top layer.
- 5. The rainforest is home to countless plant species, many of which have unique adaptations. Some plants grow on other plants for support and reach towards the sunlight, a strategy known as epiphytism. Others have large leaves that help them capture sunlight or repel water, while some produce toxic chemicals to deter herbivores.
- 6. Despite their importance, rainforests are under threat due to deforestation for agriculture, logging, and other human activities. This has led to the loss of biodiversity and disruption of ecosystems. Efforts are being made to protect and conserve these valuable ecosystems for future generations.
